
SHOOTING FOR PEACE COMMUNITY EVENT

Infrastructure and New Development

DEVELOPMENT ALONG VOLUNTEER

There are several housing developments under design/construction along the south side of Volunteer from Via Inspirada to Gilespie. Along with this development improvements are being made along Amigo and the extension of the Bermuda will be constructed to the south of Volunteer.

WEST HENDERSON AFFORDABLE FAMILY APARTMENTS

A new 100% affordable housing project consisting of 391 units, distributed among four buildings with a maximum height of 44 feet is proposed at the southeast corner of Las Vegas Boulevard and Larson Lane. A Design Review has been submitted to review architecture and site design. Currently, no waivers are being requested. This project was approved by staff in March 2025. The applicant is also requesting to utilize the affordable housing incentives that are available, depending on funding. The affordable housing incentives will require review and consideration by Council.

NEW SONG CHURCH EXPANSION

Southwest corner of Cornet Street and Reunion Drive on 5.08 acres. The expansion includes a new school addition, multi-purpose building, and church building. The applicant is also requesting to expand the school to include grades kindergarten through 5th and increase enrollment to 312 students. The project is anticipated to be scheduled for the August 14th Planning Commission meeting.

LVR MASTER DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Applications have been submitted for a 127-lot single-family subdivision consisting of detached and attached homes located at the northwest corner of Gilespie Street and Larson Lane.
